

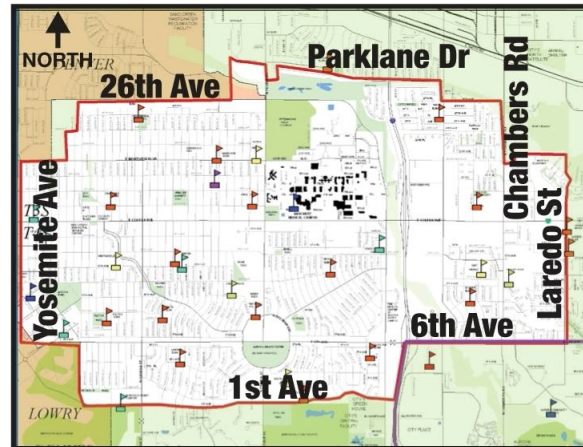
## GOALS OF THE A-GRIP MOBILE ASSESSMENT SERVICES

If you are a parent, school official or helping professional interested in getting assistance for a youth exhibiting signs of:

- **Bullying**
- **Truancy**
- **Aggressive Behavior**
- **Alcohol or Drug Experimentation or Use**
- **Minor Juvenile Offenses**
- **At-Risk Behaviors**
- **Gang Involvement**

The JAC can help you find the right services by conducting a no charge youth risk assessment.

### **What Happens During the Assessment?**

- ◇ Prior to an Initial Risk Assessment, parent/guardian reads and signs disclosure and reviews behavioral expectations of youth.
- ◇ The Mobile Assessment Specialist meets with youth in JAC's northwest Aurora satellite office to complete an Initial Risk Assessment, which identifies areas of concern.
- ◇ Family members then consult with the Mobile Assessment Specialist to develop a plan of action based on the outcome of the Risk Assessment.
- ◇ JAC staff provide individualized resource referrals to assist your family.

### **Who is Eligible for A-GRIP Mobile Assessment Services?**

- ◇ Youth between the ages of 10 to 17 years of age
- ◇ Youth who live or attend school in Northwest Aurora (see map on back panel)
- ◇ Youth who are at risk for gang involvement or currently gang-involved

### **What happens after the assessment?**

Services recommended may include:

- Mentoring
- Pro-social Activities
- Mental Health services
- Substance Abuse Services
- Case Management through A-GRIP Street Outreach Team
- Free Functional Family Therapy (FFT) through Power Up
